-Mrs. Jones was recognized at the Marion County Board of Education meeting on February 9th for designing and painting a banner entitled “Be a Superhero for Public Education”. The banner will be displayed at the Kentucky School Board Association annual conference.

-The West Marion Family Resource Center held their annual Valentine’s Dance on February 10th. The PTSO also participated by holding a basket silent auction and providing games.

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-The West Marion Academic Team placed first overall in district competition on February 11th. The Quick Recall team placed 2nd overall. The Future Problem Solving team placed 4th overall. The following students earned individual awards: Daisy Hawkins – 2nd place Mathematics, Ian Thomas – 1st place Science, Jacklyn Farmer – 3rd place Science, Owen Daugherty – 1st place Social Studies, Will Kaminski – 2nd place Social Studies, Daisy Hawkins – 1st place Language Arts, Roseanna Peterson- 3rd place Language Arts, Jacklyn Farmer – 5th place Language Arts, Taylor Hardin – 4th place Arts and Humanities, and Roseanna Peterson – 1st place Written Composition.

-The fourth and fifth grade classes took part in a week long 4-H Step Challenge. All students will be rewarded with a granola yogurt parfait.

-Twenty-seven BETA students attended the annual State BETA Convention from February 15-17 in Lexington, KY with Mr. Durham, Mrs. Kelly, Mrs. Kaminski, and parent volunteers. Several students brought products for competition or competed in talent and academic competitions. Our club's t-shirt design by Will Kaminski and banner design by Rose Caldwell (made by Rose and Reece Caldwell, Izzy Lyvers, Emma Edelen, and Chloe Johnston) both placed in the Top Ten. After an interview process, those projects, however, did not qualify for national competition. Two of our students' projects received top honors in their divisions. Izzy Lyvers's quilt and Makayla Mattingly's painting both placed second in their categories and have been invited to compete at the National Convention in Orlando, Florida in June.

-Mrs. Burdette's students performed a play at WMES for all students on February 16th. They performed the play on February 17th at the Loretto Motherhouse and the Village of Lebanon.

-Kindergarten registration was held on February 17th.
